





DATE: 01.08.23








Event/Activity details:









Reading Festival

The event "Meet an author" was most cherished event of the day, as the people of the local community and students of the participating schools Khanna High School for girls High













Special Camp 2023-24

Date: 29.03.2024 to 04.04.2024

The highlights on each of the activities from the NSS special camp organised by the NSS Unit of Sir Gurudas Mahavidyalaya, Kolkata which reflects the positive impact of these community-oriented initiatives, promoting well-being, health, and awareness.

Day - 1 (29.03.2024)

Inaugural Session, Volunteer registration, Volunteer orientation and Visit to the Locality Around the College. Locality and Campus Cleaning Under Clean Campus, Green Campus Initiative.

Locality and Campus Cleaning:

College Campus Cleaning by NSS Volunteers followed by Cleaning of Road adjacent to College by NSS Volunteers and talking to the residents about the importance of clean surroundings for Wellbeing.

Students and NSS volunteers undertook an initiative to clean the

















locality surrounding the college. They engaged in collecting waste materials, especially plastic waste, and cleaning public spaces. This initiative encouraged the community to maintain cleanliness and supported the goal of a sustainable, green environment.

Community members showed interest in organising future cleanliness drives with the NSS Volunteers. Awareness regarding waste segregation and plastic pollution was also spread.

Distribution of Bleaching Powder Packets in Local Households and shops was done.

NSS volunteers distributed packets of bleaching powder to local households to promote hygiene and sanitation. The initiative aimed to help households in managing potential sources of infection and improve general cleanliness. Volunteers provided demonstrations on its safe and effective use. Feedback from the community indicated appreciation for the support in maintaining sanitary conditions.







A Special Session on "Environment and Sustainability" was conducted for the local community and NSS volunteers, focusing on conservation, recycling, and sustainable living practices.

Attendees, including local residents and students, participated in the session. Participants gained knowledge about recycling, the harmful impact of plastic, and ways to minimize waste. The session concluded with a pledge to adopt eco-friendly practices. Taking Pledge for Taking Care for Environment by NSS Volunteers was done.

Discussion, encouraging and taking suggestions from the NSS Volunteers on creating a Special Herbal Garden in the college premises and area around the college premises with the Idea of "Wellbeing with natural herbal remedies in daily life".



















Day - 2 (30.03.2024)

Dengue Awareness:

Survey and Program for prevention of Vector-Borne Disease

NSS volunteers conducted a survey in the local area around the college to assess awareness of dengue prevention. Awareness drive to educate residents on the importance of eliminating stagnant water, using mosquito repellents, and maintaining cleanliness to prevent vector-borne diseases was done. Informative posters were displayed. Volunteers reported increased awareness among residents, many of whom pledged to keep their surroundings



















free from mosquito-breeding sites. The local shopkeepers were provided with packets of bleaching powder.

Awareness Session on Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention:

An awareness session was held on the detrimental effects of alcohol and drug abuse, discussing its impact on individuals and society. Preventive measures and support resources were highlighted for those at risk. The session saw participation from community members, and feedback indicated heightened awareness and commitment to addressing this issue. Discussions emphasised the importance of family support and community vigilance.













Day - 3 (31.03.2024)

Awareness Session on Women's Health and Hygiene

A special session on women's health and hygiene was conducted, during which NSS volunteers distributed health and hygiene kits to women in the local community. Topics included menstrual health, hygiene practices, and accessing healthcare resources. Females participated, and many expressed gratitude for the useful kits. The program increased awareness of personal health, particularly regarding menstrual hygiene, which was a new topic for many attendees.

Empowering Women Through Self-Defense and Gender Sensitization Program

An empowerment session was conducted focusing on self-defence skills and gender sensitization. Discussions were held on gender equality and societal well-being.

Participants learned basic selfdefence techniques and discussed gender issues, helping build confidence and awareness regarding women's rights and safety.













Day - 4 (01.04.2024)

Eye Care and Career Counseling Awareness Program with Sushrut Eye Care Foundation

In partnership with the Sushrut Eye Care Foundation, an awareness program on the importance of eye care was organised, including career opportunities in the field.

The session had over 70 participants who received information on eye health and potential career paths in optometry and eye care. It emphasised the significance of regular eye check-ups and the importance of vision care.

The Sushrut Eye Care Foundation set up an eye check-up camp at the college, providing free eye screenings to students, faculty, and local community members.

Over 100 people received eye checkups. The camp identified several cases needing further treatment, and individuals were referred to the foundation for follow-up care.





















Day - 5 (02.04.2024)

Waste Management and Environmental Awareness Program

An awareness program on waste management was conducted, focusing on proper waste disposal, recycling, and environmental conservation. The program aimed to educate the community on reducing waste. Local community members attended and engaged in discussions about waste management. Attendees expressed increased awareness of the importance of reducing plastic use and recycling.




























Day - 7 (04.04.2024)

































































































UNDERSTANDING ELECTROMAGNETIC POLLUTION


Electrosmog/electropollution.


- Fourth of the great sources of pollution after water resources, atmosphere& noise by WHO.
