

LIBRARY INDUCTION CLASSES

The library induction classes have been introduced with the primary aim of correlating the teaching process with the library usage of the students so that a completion in the cycle of academic input of the teachers is achieved. The process of teaching —learning is actually intervened by the proper use of the library.

A student who utilizes the library facilities along with the classroom teaching gains the true potentiality in doing good academic result.

A hands-on experience of the students along with the concerned faculty and the librarian on library usage renders the scope of exploring the loopholes or gaps that may exist in utilizing the library facilities.

- The students are not being able to search the resources properly.
- The resources available are not in the correct proportion to the number of students in that particular discipline.
- The students are not getting the resources as per the standard of their assimilation and requirement.
- The resources prescribed during class hours are not available in the collection.
- The students are reluctant to use or not well aware of the significance of the online facilities in their learning process.
- The students are not being able to understand why they may see a journal?
- The students are not actually getting the skill of how to take notes from the resources available at the library.

A one-to-one interpersonal communication and training for a stipulated period of time in a structured way in the beginning may help in inculcating the interest in academic usage of the library as well as boost the confidence of students for doing good results.

The skill of library use promotes self study.

- e) If we use materials from the library, we should re-shelve them only if we know where the materials should be places. Otherwise, we should bring that to our librarian to keep it in a proper place.



MAKING LANGUAGE LEARNING MORE ENJOYABLE

Dr. Paramita Halder, **HOD**, Department of English has contributed to the SPOKEN ENGLISH **INITIATIVE** of the Central Library in many a ways... This write-up this year too is an encouraging effort to alleviate the fear of English language. The interesting nature of it also unfolded. Language learning is easy and is the need of the hour for the students especially for those who want to adapt to the higher education with a global outlook. A language can never stand as a barrier in the path of success.

A child naturally acquires its mother tongue in its growing up years. A wing language serves as an aid to conscious thought; it also enters into one's subconscious and one's dreams. It provides one with a creative mental and intellectual tool. It allows one not only to communicate with family and immediate community, but also establish a personal identity within that community. All these functions are mainly served by one's mother tongue, but in to-day's context, one needs to learn different languages as they serve to open doors to knowledge and pave ways to higher studies. A second language also allows its speakers to communicate with different social groups. It has been, therefore necessary for one to acquire bilingual or multilingual voices.

In India, students have to learn the English language simultaneously with their mother tongue. The main focus in second language learning has been to enable the students to have the basic communicative skills i.e. listening, speaking, reading and writing (along with comprehending). But unfortunately, it is mostly observed that students fail to have a grip on the language. Students begin to learn English in their primary school days but why they are so weak in the language is a question which always puzzles us.

It is true that language learning is hard work. One must make an effort to understand, to repeat accurately, to manipulate newly understood language and to use the whole range of known language in conversation or written composition. Effort is required at every moment and must be maintained over a long period of time. The process, therefore, tends to become monotonous. So, to motivate the students, the teaching - learning atmosphere should be improvised to make it more dynamic and interesting, When the students learn e.g. grammar in their school days, the entire teaching learning experience often becomes a structure based, formal activity. Moreover it becomes mostly text book oriented. As a result, students tend to lose interest and generally memorize rules to pass their examination. Even if they learn the rules, they fail to find a real context to apply what they have learnt.

To improve this situation some well-developed techniques may be used which will be both innovative and fascinating. Activity oriented language classes enable students to practice all the skills of communication especially the oral skill in which they are mostly weak. Such activities can be play-acting, quiz contests, verbal games, public speaking etc. While young learners have to be guided by the teacher, advanced students i.e. high school and college students can form a study group and practice among themselves to improve their English.

Here, an attempt will be made to discuss a few instances of how to use 'games' in language learning. Games help to encourage learners to sustain their interest and work. Games also help to create contexts in which the language is useful and meaningful. Let us discuss here two such games which are simple, widely popular, as well as can help young learners to learn and practice a language.

The first one is known as Hangman which may be played within the whole class or in pairs. It helps to enhance and improve learner's vocabulary.

Procedure - Think of a word, mention how many lettered word it is (e.g. whether it has five or six letters) to your partner. The other player(s) suggest a letter which they think may be in the word. If it is correct, write it above the appropriate dash. If it is not, draw one part of the 'hanged man' as in the illustration. Thirteen mistakes hangs the other player(s).

The library has a collection of books on general intelligence and career career guidance. A variation of Hangman may be played in which each dash represents a word, instead of a letter as above. When all the words have been correctly guessed and filled in, the result is a meaningful sentence. It helps if the topic of ft the sentence is stated before the games starts, or is contextualised by a picture.

The second game helps to teach some particular sentence structures. It is known as 'Twenty questions'. The process involves asking questions to acquire information. There are many versions of this game. A common version version was played regularly on BBC radio. In this, the question-master thinks of something and simply tells the player whether it is 'animal, vegetable, mineral or abstract.' The players can then put 20 questions to the question-master to its discover what he is thinking of. Traditionally the questions are put so that they can be answered in 'Yes' or 'No'. This of course may vary depending on the topic we are attempting to learn. One example may help to illustrate this point —

First Player - "I have thought of a celebrity."

Second Player - "Is he an Indian?"

First - "Yes, he is."

Second Player - "Is he alive?"

First - "No, he is not."

Second Player - "Was he a politicia

Second Player - "Was he a politician?"

First - "No, he was not."

Second Player - "Was he a film-maker?"

Second Player - "Was he a film-maker?"

First - "Yes, he was a film-maker?"

Second Player - "Was he from West Bengal?"


First - "Yes, he was from West Bengal."

Second Player - "Are you thinking of Satyajit Roy?"

First - "Yes, you are right."

We can observe that in this game, the players are repeatedly getting scope to practice two types of sentence structures — v.i.z. Interrogative sentence and Assertive Sentence.

Enjoyment of these types of verbal games is not restricted by age. Both young and advanced learners, therefore, can be motivated through these simple and interesting techniques. The need for meaningfulness in language learning has been widely accepted. A useful interpretation of 'meaningfulness' is that learners respond to the content in a definite way. If they are amused, challenged, intrigued or surprised the content becomes clearly meaningful to them. Thus the meaning of the language they listen to, read, speak and write will be more vividly experienced and, therefore, better remembered and better learnt.





সংস্কৃত বনাম বাংলা ভাষা

প্রখ্যাত ভাষাবিদ্ অধ্যাপক শ্রী সত্যরঞ্জন বন্দ্যোপাধ্যায় 'সংস্কৃত বনাম বাংলা ব্যাকরণ' গ্রন্থে ব্যাকরণের একটা ধারাবাহিক ইতিহাস লিখেছেন। দেশ-বিদেশের ব্যাকরণের সঙ্গে সংস্কৃত ব্যাকরণের একটা তুলনা করে বংলা ভাষা পর্যন্ত এসেছেন। সেজন্য গ্রন্থটা অনবদ্য ও অভিনব।

ভাষায় মানুষ কখন কি শব্দ প্রয়োগ করে তার কোন নির্দিষ্ট নিয়ম নেই। বহু সংস্কৃত শব্দ বাংলা সাহিত্যে খুব বিশেষভাবে প্রচলিত ছিল, কিন্তু বর্তমানে সেই সব শব্দ একেবারেই অপ্রচলিত হয়ে গেছে। আবার অনেক দুরাহ কঠিন সংস্কৃত শব্দ এখন বাংলায় ব্যবহার হচ্ছে। বাংলা ব্যাকরণ লেখার ইতিহাসের ধার বিদেশীরাই প্রবর্তন করেছেন। যদিও দশম শতাব্দীতে সেই চর্যাপদের যুগ থেকে বাংলা ভাষার ব্যাকরণ লেখার ইতিহাস শুরু হয়েছে এক বিদেশী পর্তুগীজ লেখকের মাধ্যমে। ব্যাকরণ লিখতে গেলে ব্যাকরণের বিভিন্ন বিষয়ের একটা সংজ্ঞা দিতে হয়। ব্যাকরণ রচনার আর একটি দিক হল - সামান্য বিশেষ ন্যায়। ব্যাকরণের প্রথম নিয়মটি হবে সামান্য নিয়ম। যদি সামান্য নিয়মের ব্যতিক্রম কিছু শব্দে দেখা যায়, তা হলে তার জন্য বিশেষ নিয়ম করতে হবে। বর্তমান যুগে আধুনিক বিজ্ঞানসম্মত উপায়ে ব্যাকরণ লেখার কতকগুলো পদ্ধতি আছে। সেগুলো হল ধ্বনিতত্ত্ব, রাপতত্ত্ব, বাক্যরীতি, শব্দার্থতত্ত্ব এবং শব্দের নিরুক্তি। প্রথম তিনটিই হল ভাষা শিক্ষার সোপান।

Career in IT is considered as one of the most highest paying jobs and full of opportunities that can take a person to higher levels. A B.Tech or B.Sc./ BCA/ MCA can become an IT engineer. A person requires +2 with mathematics to pursue B.Sc in computer science. Others without mathematics can also pursue major course in computer science. Besides that various certification and diploma courses are also available in small packages.

Depending upon your interest the career in IT can be chosen. The various options available are as follows:

- Software Developer: These are professionals involved in design and coding, project management, computer programming etc.
- > Hardware Engineer: These

- professionals are concerned with hardware parts such as circuit board, computer chip, printer, keyboard etc.
- System Designer: Professionals involved in system designing that is logical and physical designing including files, database and procedures etc.
- System Analyst: Performs research about existing problems and plan for the solutions.
- Networking Engineer: Involved in designing, implementation and processing of computer networks.
- DBA (Database Administrators) These professionals are involved in design, implementation and maintainence of database of various client companies.

Candidates with high percentage of marks and good communication skills and sound computer knowledge do not face any problem in getting a job in IT companies. Computer engineers can get job in non-IT companies as well. Colleges, Universities, research fields can also be a career option. Working as programmer or E-


